Routt County's current Hazard Mitigation Plan was originally developed in 2010 with a requirement to review and update at five (5) year intervals. This will be the first update of the 2010 Plan. Since 2010, FEMA has updated its guidance to help local officials develop hazard mitigation plans.

VIII. SUMMARY AND OTHER OPTIONS:

Consideration for approval and authorization for the Chair to sign the PDM 2017 Encumbrance #17PDM19RC Grant Agreement between the State of Colorado, Department of Public Safety and Routt County.

Grant funding will be used for the development of a FEMA-approvable multi-jurisdictional local Hazard Mitigation Plan (HMP) Update with adherence to the most current FEMA guidance. Subrecipient will hire a contractor to complete an HMP Update for Routt County. The HMP Update will meet all of FEMA's requirements.

Failure to update the 2010 Routt County Hazard Mitigation Plan could potentially result in Routt County not being eligible for future FEMA grant funding.
