MAHFAB Report re: MAHFAB grant- Construction Documents

The Hayden Heritage Center was awarded a MAHFAB grant in December of 2016 to obtain construction documents for the Museums ongoing expansion project which includes the reconstruction and rehabilitation of an historic wooden granary donated to the museum which is to be repurposed as the Museum annex to hold the Museums agricultural collections many of which are stored outdoors exposed to the weather or offsite. The annex will give the Museum some stretch room and will allow for community use space, storage space and ADA restroom facilities. The wooden granary was disassembled by the National Center for Craftsmanship and Hayden High School students and the materials moved to the museum property summer 2016.

The Hayden Heritage Center closed out the Construction document grant this past May 2018. The original grant award was for \$4,945 (50% of anticipated expenditures of \$9890.00). We were able to close the grant under the amount awarded and submitted reimbursement for \$4202.23 (Total cost of the project was \$8404.45).
