



HAHNS PEAK AREA HISTORICAL SOCIETY

In 2016, Hahns Peak Area Historical Society applied for, and was approved for a grant to work with the Northwest Colorado Cultural Heritage Program to fabricate and install a large scale interpretive sign at the Steamboat Lake State Park.

On July 28, 2017 representatives of the Hahns Peak Area Historical Society and Nancy Kramer NWCCHP, and park representatives met at the State Park and a site for the sign was chosen. The frame for the sign was ordered and paid for by HPAHS. The sign panels were ordered and on August 19, 2017 the sign frame and temporary panels was installed.

Nancy Kramer was recently contacted and informed us that the original company who was to fabricate the permanent sign panels has gone out of business. She has established contact with another company and feels that they will provide the sign panels in August. Hopefully this will come to fruition, the panels will be installed and the grant will be closed out.

We appreciate receiving the grant from MAHFAB and the assistance of NWCCHP in the completion of this project.

The planned staining of the pole barn and addition has been completed. Further plans are to replace the rotting logs under the historic dynamite shed, and repair of the fence this summer.

HPAHS continues to work to accomplish our goal of historic education and preservation. We continue to receive great community support and time given by many volunteers.
