



**A & C. Mission Building—Pool Hall
140 South Walnut Street, Hayden**

The two-story False-Front Vernacular Storefront Mission Building-Pool Hall, with concealed gable roof behind false store front, with large display windows and a double-door entry, was constructed in 1904. It was first identified with William R. Walker (See Walker below), who deeded the original Hayden townsite circa 1895 and built the original structure as an Assembly of God church. By 1908, the Mutual Telephone Company was created by a group of neighboring ranchers and housed in the Mission Building. Subsequently, the building has served as a restaurant, a bakery, a retail establishment, and a barber shop. In 1911, an addition was constructed behind the building that housed a pool hall on the first floor and provided rooms for rent on the second floor. The pool hall later served as a bowling alley. The exterior façade and features of the building essentially reflect the building's original architectural integrity.
