Fire Facts

Location

6 miles east of Yampa, CO & 16 miles west of Kremmling, CO on the Routt National Forest

Fire size today: 4,093 acres

Containment: 57% contained

Fire start date: June 20, 2021

Cause: Lightning

Temporary Flight Restriction

Management

Great Basin Team 2, Type 3 Incident Management Team

Current Situation

- At 6:00 pm on Monday, July 5, Great Basin Team 2 (Type 3) assumed command of the Muddy Slide Fire.
- This fire is expected to be a long-duration event, and additional resources will be made available as they are needed, depending upon fire activity.
- Areas of heat were identified in the northwest corner of the fire. Firefighters have been able to work near the fire's edge to cool hot spots in this area. Expect isolated thunderstorms and showers Thursday through Saturday and gusts up to 16 mph.

Operational plan for today

- Crews will continue to work around the fires edge on the west side of the fire as weather permits. Equipment continues to make indirect line improvements while securing the line around the uncontrolled fire line with hand crews, going direct when its safe. The previous days rain was measured with a remote automated weather station on the northwest of the fire with a total of .13 inches. With continued moisture in the forecast, it will help cool hot spots on the north end of the fire, and around Muddy and Clear Creek. Helicopters will continue to drop water on the heated areas as well keeping spot fires to a minimum.
- On the south side of the fire, heavy equipment will be used to remove fuels and secure fire lines. This will provide a safe site for any potential burnout operations, should future conditions allow.

Fire Conditions and Weather

Scattered thunderstorms forecasted may bring moisture and lightning to
the area. Gusty outflow winds around cells may increase fire behavior
along uncontrolled fireline and green islands. Isolated tree torching and
spotting very likely if thunderstorms are dry. Another concern will be
lightning in or near the fire area causing new starts and exhausting
Incident and local resources.
